

**TIPS TO
IDENTIFY
I.C.E.**

It can be difficult to tell whether or not officers are ICE or a legitimate law enforcement operation. We do not want to cause unnecessary panic with false alarms so it's important to do your best to accurately assess the situation before alerting the community.

We highly recommend that you follow CORRN to learn about their confirmer trainings! They are the local experts and many suspected sightings are not ICE.

We highly recommend that you follow Colorado Rapid Response Network to learn about their confirmed trainings! They are the local experts and many suspected sightings are not ICE.



CORRN has pictures taken at confirmed raids on their social media. It can be helpful to scroll through their posts to familiarize yourself with the appearance of local raids.

I.C.E. AGENT APPEARANCE

Vest may say ...

- POLICE ICE, POLICE HSI, POLICE FEDERAL AGENT, POLICE HOMELAND SECURITY, DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY POLICE, CBP BORDER PATROL, USBP, ERO, POLICE

Or vests may have no identifier.



I.C.E. AGENT APPEARANCE



- I.C.E. agent vests will not say Sheriff or SWAT.
- I.C.E. agents are not uniformed officers.
- Local police department officers will typically identify themselves as local PD when asked.

DEA, FBI, U.S. MARSHAL, & ATF

DHS is allowing other federal agencies to carry out the “functions” of immigration officers. DEA, FBI, U.S. Marshal, and ATF are known to be on that list. ICE and CBP are the primary enforcers at this time. Just because you see federal agencies does not mean that you are seeing an ICE raid.

I.C.E. AGENT APPEARANCE



- Some I.C.E. agents wear masks and some don't.
- Two, three, or four agents are typical for targeting individuals.
- Many local agents are women and people of color.
- Normally one or two agents per vehicle and multiple vehicles on scene.

I.C.E. VEHICLES

So heavily tinted you can't see inside.

Bars in the windows or dividing the front seat from the back.


One SWAT style vehicle that has **HOMELAND SECURITY** on the back. Local SWAT has the name of the jurisdiction on their vehicles.



I.C.E. VEHICLES

- Dark Chevy, Ford, and Jeep SUVs are common.
- Black or silver Dodge Chargers may be on the scene.
- White Ford and Ram transit vans with VERY heavily tinted windows.
- Personal cars that are not American made.





I.C.E. LICENSE PLATES

- License plates are typically regular plates, not government plates.
- Some cars have temporary plates or dealership placards.
- They occasionally remove or cover their plates.
